Welcome to Camp in a Box - we'll bring camp to you!

We are facing difficult times due to COVID-19 and we have planned a fun, engaging and safe program for Scouts BSA. We are committed to give you a quality program just as if your Scout was at summer camp. The information in this packet is intended to make your preparation for camp run smoothly. We look forward seeing you virtually this summer!

How does this work?

Just like summer camp, we will have an opening and closing ceremony each day. Each Scout will be able to earn up to five merit badges or participate in our First Year Camper program and earn up to three merit badges. There will be live demos and guest speakers throughout the week.

What's in the box?

Camp in a Box T-shirt, Camp in a Box Patch, Mystery Bag, Advancement Supplies as needed, Scouting goodies.

How does the virtual part work?

The live streaming will include pledge, oath, law, exercises, songs, skits, advancements, demonstrations and interviews. We will also have weekly campfires. Merit badges will be completed online via Google Classrooms & merit badge instruction will be via Google Meet. Live streaming of general program will be via Zoom.

Is this for everyone?

Camp in a Box is open to all registered Scouts BSA members. Scouts will need access to a computer and the internet to participate in this program. Please remember we are located in the beautiful Hudson Valley, New York, and each day will begin 8:45AM EST.

Merit Badges?

We will be offering 48 merit badges over a four-week period. Each Scout will be given the opportunity to **take up to five classes**. There will also be a First Year Camper Program allowing scouts the opportunities to work on rank advancement for Scout, Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class.

What's the price?

\$95 for one week, additional weeks or siblings are \$75. All four weeks are \$300. Payments are due at the time of registration. Class size limits?

Safety at Camp:

Even though we are not physically at camp, we still need to take measures so that our campers are safe!



Youth Protection Training: All staff and merit badge counselors are registered BSA leaders and have updated their Youth Protection training in 2020. All youth protection policies still apply in an online environment. Ensure you always have <u>two-deep leadership</u> for online activities and meetings. Our ban on one-on-one contact between an adult leader and youth applies to all interactions — whether in person, online, through a web conference, over the phone, via text, or in any other form.

Parents: All aspects of the Scouting program are open to observation by parents.

Recording: NO part of the online activities or meetings may be recorded.

Platforms: We are only using business-based platforms for Camp In A Box: Zoom and Google Classroom.

Cyber Chip: It is recommended that scouts earn their Cyber Chip before participating in Camp in a Box. It is optional.



Scouts BSA Program Offerings:

Merit Badges:

Scouts attending Camp in a Box have an opportunity to earn up to 5 merit badges per week, during their time at camp. Schedules are provided later in this packet allowing the scouts to plan out their experience prior to the start of camp. Our trained counselors are ready and eager to help your scout work towards achieving these Merit Badges. Scouts should seek guidance from their unit leaders on the badges they intend to take.

Prerequisites:

Some merit badges have prerequisites that are required to be completed before camp in order to fully earn the badge. Campers are still able to take these badges but may only earn a partial if the prerequisites are not completed ahead of time. Merit badges with prerequisites are noted in this packet.

Materials Costs:

Some merit badges have an extra cost associated with them due to special materials needed. You may purchase these materials when you select your classes.

Homework:

Some Merit Badges require the campers to put in extra work at home or meet a certain level of skill in order to obtain the merit badge. Failure to complete these assignments or meet these skills may result in a partial.

First Year Camper Program:

We are excited to offer a First Year Camper Program, which takes place during a two-hour period each day. During this time, campers will work on the skills and requirements for the ranks of Scout, Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class. It is important to note; Not all requirements can be done virtually, we will not "sign off" on completion, instead we will provide you with a report on what was worked on to show your Scoutmaster. You may still have to demonstrate the skills you learned to have your troop leadership sign off.

Registering for classes:

After you register with the Hudson Valley Council, you will be emailed a link to our merit badge schedule and tracking system, Tentaroo where you will create your own account and you can access your blue cards after camp is over.

Does my Scout need to have his/her own e-mail address?

Yes. Parents will need to ensure they have their unit Scoutmaster's name AND Email Address to be able to complete their registration! Scouts will need their own e-mail address and **CAN NOT** use their parent's e-mail address. Additionally, if you have multiple Scouts you are registering within a family or unit, they also **CAN NOT** use the same e-mail address as their needs to be (1) e-mail address per student for the classroom invitation and access. Please ensure your e-mail address is correct as that is the record we will have on file for you and your Scout when you register. If we get an "undeliverable" notification, we do not have the means to add you to the Google Classroom without your correct e-mail.

PLEASE NOTE:

Many Scouts' e-mails addresses are not able to be used as they are already associated with a Google G Suite for their school district. Please do not use anything from a (.org) like "john.smoth@cornwallcentral.org" as it will not be able to be added.
